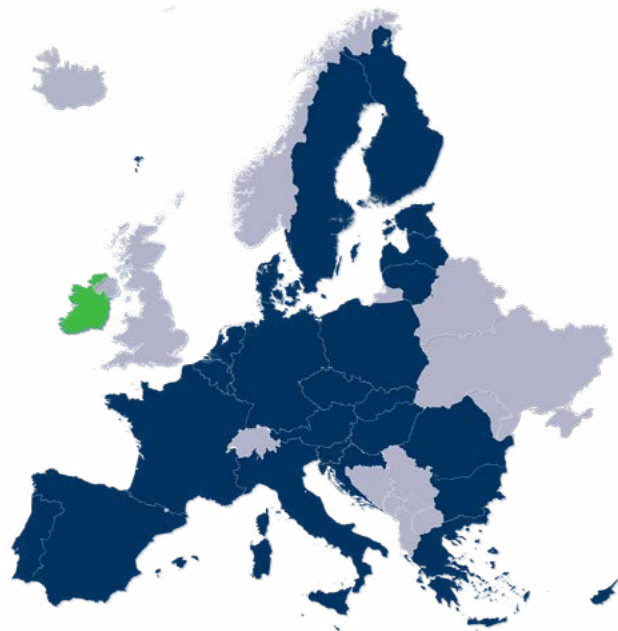

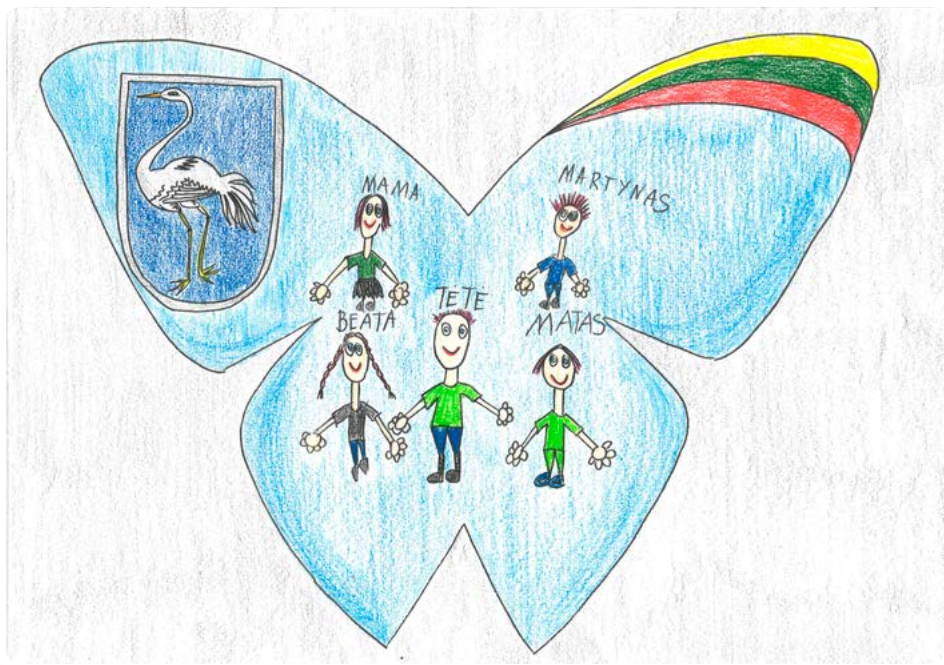
3rd Prize

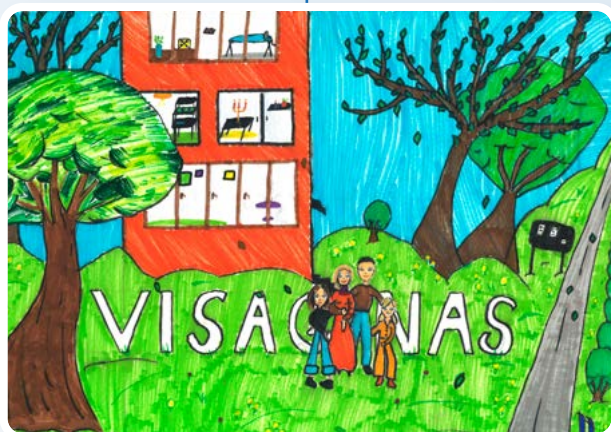


1st Prize

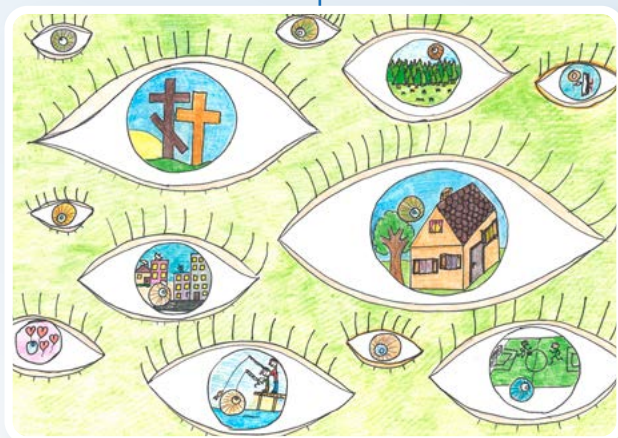


1st Prize

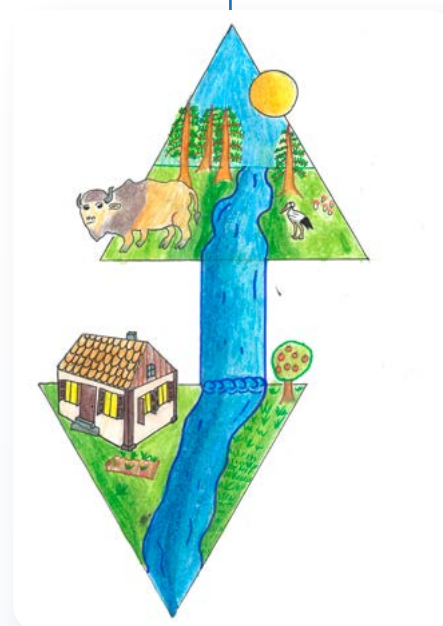




2nd Prize
